At St Clare's College, we proudly honour the legacy of St Clare of Assisi—a woman of deep faith, humility, service, and courageous leadership. Guided by her values, our Scholarship Program recognises and supports students who embody these qualities in their academic, personal, and community pursuits. Each year, we award scholarships to students entering key transition years:

Year Level	Scholarships Awarded	Discount on Fees
Year 7	2	25%
Year 9	2	25%
Year 11	Up to 4	30%

Each scholarship is tenable for **two years**, and recipients are welcome to reapply in future transition years.

Year Level	Category	Criteria
Years 7 - 8	Junior	Early promise in academics, arts, sports, leadership, or service
Years 9 - 10	Intermediate	Emerging excellence in academics, arts, sports, leadership, or service
Years 11 - 12	Senior	Proven success in academics, arts, sports, leadership, or service

Application Requirements

- Completed application form
- Two most recent school reports (Year 7 applicants only)
- Personal statement (see guidelines below)
- Recommendation letter (teacher, Parish Priest, primary Principal)
- Supporting evidence of achievements (relevant to category)

Personal Statement Guidelines

Your statement should identify the area/s in which you excel, reflect how you identify with the values of St Clare and how you demonstrate these in your life and particularly your area of excellence. Include:

- Area/s in which you excel
- The St Clare's values you connect with most
- Real-life examples of how you live out these values
- How you will continue to uphold them as a scholarship recipient in the area of excellence

Statement word-count guidelines:

- Year 7 Applicants: 250–400 words
- Year 9 Applicants: 500–700 words
- Year 11 Applicants: 800–1000 words (must also highlight contributions to the College in the relevant category)

- Maintain strong academic and co-curricular engagement
- Continue to demonstrate alignment with St Clare's values
- Actively participate in activities related to their scholarship category
